Basic information






Polish CIOFF® has organizational traditions starting from the very beginning of CIOFF® World.

Polonez is a Polish stately processional dance performed by couples who walk around the dance hall.

The music is in triple metre and is often danced at the "studniówka", the prom for students graduating high school.

Since 2019 Polonez has been on the International List of Intangible Cultural Heritage UNESCO.
